The event, which was scheduled for seven hours, had over 25 acts and presentations including modern and folk dances, songs, skits and awards. The acts were performed by both children and adults, and were all very entertaining. In addition to the entertainment, all attendees were able to enjoy great food. Snacks were available early in the day (including great chai) and then for dinner the cafeteria was filled to capacity as all 600+ people were served a very tasty, Telugu dinner which included ariselu and pakodi..

We had the opportunity to speak with many attendees about the mission and goal of Hope Abides and were fortunate to receive some donations of both cash and used cell phones for our fundraising drive. We also connectied with local talent which we may persuade to perform at our fundraising dinner later in 2011. This was the first event at which Hope Abides had a presence and we found it to be a great opportunity to network with the community.

In addition to Hope Abides, several vendors and organizations had tables or booths. There were representatives from local robotics teams, travel agents, religious organizations and other area businesses. Additionally, there was a crafts table for the younger attendees.
