Last month, in conjunction with our clean water partner For One Another Foundation (FOA), four volunteers traveled to India to distribute clean water solutions and to visit some of our partner organizations. Junior Ambassador Scarlett, her mother Tara, aunt Shana and supporter Angelica visited the Kuriakose Elias Service Society (KESS) in the state of Kerala. They met with Fr. Dr. Joy Vattoly of KESS who coordinated meeting with woman involved with KESS programs who were in need of clean water filters for their homes.

They also discussed, and agreed to fund, a critically needed bore well in the drought stricken Jaigaon region of Maharashtra. The filters and the bore well are possible through the financial support of FOA and funds raised by the Scarlett and 'her team'.

From there the four traveled to Vellatur to visit partners Mission for the Rural People, Moparru Orphanage and Brooke Orphanage. One of the highlights of that trip was to see a FOA funded filtration system that provides clean desalinized



water to Brooke Orphanage and also to the residents of the whole village. This is monumental as it saves the residents from having to travel miles to collect clean water or to pay for expensive bottled water. (con't right).
