This year we were able to fund tuition for many of the kids at one particular partner, but had to bypass one deserving girl, Saroja, as the tuition cost of her program was too steep.

Thanks to a recent generous grant from the Guru Krupa Foundation we have been able to provide her tuition for the upcoming school year.

With the help of GRF, tuition for several of the children at two of our partner orphanages is secure into 2020/2021.
