A Trip to India by Brent Adams, Founder In late September and early October, I had the pleasure and privilege of visiting India and touring nearly 20 different children's homes in 12 days. While many of the visits were short, it gave me the opportunity to learn a bit of their

operations, best practices and challenges.

My travels took me from Kerala in South India to Andhra Pradesh to Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand and finally to Pune and Mumbai. While the main focus of the trip was learning from and about the orphanages, there was time for stops in Kerala at shrines to St Thomas and Mother Mary as well as Silent Valley, a nature preserve; in Delhi there were visits to the Lotus Temple of the Baha'i Faith as well as to Gandhi's shrine; and in Uttarakhand we visited the holy cities of Hardwar and Rishikesh which sit at the base of the Himalayas.



I was fortunate to be joined on my travels by Father Anto Pudussery, General Auditor of the 3,000 strong Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI). Not only was he gracious enough to help me navigate around the country for the entire 12 days, he also has 27 years experience doing Social Welfare work and has been responsible for opening two or three orphanages himself. It was a valuable opportunity for me to learn from his experiences. Also, joining us to travel about Kerala were Father James Narithookil, CMI who is CMI's director of Ecumenical and Interreligious Dialogue and Father Varghese Kokkadan who is their General Councilor for Social Apostolate.

While the conditions at the facilities varied greatly depending on factors such as rural vs. urban, new vs wellestablished, number of children, ties to community, etc. they all are doing amazing and inspirational work. The children are loved, fed, sheltered and receiving an education. The difference between the lives they lead vs the lives of many street children is stark. (cont'd right column below)
